



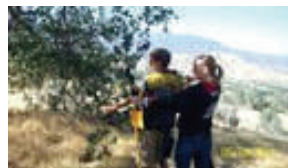
The Summer 3D Unmarked Shoot ...

There were 23 participants who showed up for the Summer 3D shoot. Although it had warmed up a lot from the week before we started early (7 a.m.) and beat the heat. As I



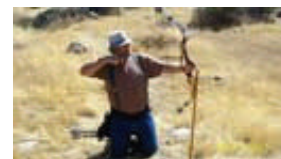
have said often in my emails I usually

Be prepared to start planning to help out. I know Paul Cooper will be looking for volunteers to help with clouts and at food booths.

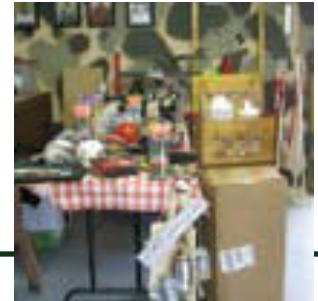
Nancy Kirtley will be looking to recruit

Stefanie Kern will be looking to all members to help

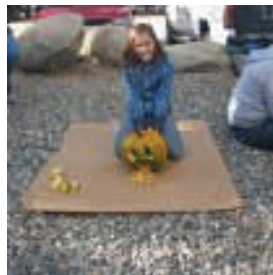
get raffle gifts to her. She has even requested them early. In fact the earlier the better. That way we are assured that there will be

Let's do the High Sierra right again. If you haven't been to one of our events in a while come up and enjoy the festivities and meet some new people!

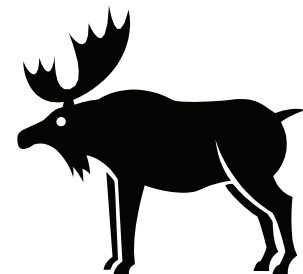
Recipe Corner- Wild Game Chili

Here is a great recipe using ground venison or other ground meat like elk or beef. This one you can save for when the weather starts turning cold or if you go to the beach and want to cook something warm.

1 lb ground meat (venison, elk, beef)
1 lb sausage
1 large onion
2 cloves garlic minced
2 28 oz cans stewed tomatoes
1/4 cup chopped green pepper
1 4 oz can chopped green chili
1 15 oz can kidney beans

2 tbs cumin
1/2 tsp seasoning salt
2 tbs chili powder
1 tbs coriander, ground
1 cup ketchup
Black pepper & cayenne pepper

Sauté onion, green pepper and garlic until tender. Brown ground meat and sausage and drain. Place all ingredients in a large pot and bring to a boil and cook for 30 minutes, seasoning to taste with black pepper and cayenne pepper. Stir often.
